# **United Nations Trust Fund to End Violence Against Women**

WJI received a three-year grant from the United Nations to support our innovative work to ensure Mayan women and girls can live a life free from violence. WJI was one of 33 grantees selected from 1,715 applicants.

#### Central America & Mexico Youth Fund (CAMY Fund)

WJI was one of four regional grantees to receive a grant from the CAMY Fund to support our work developing community solutions for eradicating child marriage.
